

What leads to suicide?

There is no single cause. Suicide most often occurs when stressors and health issues converge to create an experience of hopelessness and despair. Depression is the most common condition associated with suicide, and it is often undiagnosed or untreated. Most people who actively manage their mental health conditions go on to engage in life.

Have an honest conversation.

If you are worried about someone, assume you are the only one who will reach out.

- Talk to them in private, and tell them you care.
- Listen to their story
- Avoid debating the value of life, minimizing their problems, or giving advice.
- It's okay to ask directly about suicide.
- Encourage them to seek help or to contact their doctor or therapist.

Childhood Cancer Awareness Month

On average, more than 290 children and adolescents in the U.S. are diagnosed with cancer each week. St. Jude Children's Hospital in Memphis, TN develops treatments through research. Since it's opening in 1962, St. Jude has helped improve the overall childhood cancer survival rate from 20% to more than 80%. St. Jude leads more clinical trials for childhood cancer than any other children's hospital in the United. States. Worldwide, about 400,000 children and adolescents develop cancer each year. Only half of these children's diseases are diagnosed. The research and treatments discovered by St. Jude are shared with the World Health Organization (WHO) being the only WHO collaborating center for childhood cancer. "The mission of St. Jude Children's Research Hospital is to advance cures, and means of prevention, for pediatric catastrophic diseases through research and treatment.
